# FAQs

## Are talks available outside their featured month?

Each talk is labeled *Available now* or *Available beginning [Month]*. Once a talk premieres, it remains available to book!

## Do you offer other talks?

Absolutely! Most of [Kelli's 50+ talks](#) center on Chicago's 130-year film history, but she also provides programs on broader topics like women in Hollywood, film noir, and Christmas movies.

## Are the talks interactive?

Yes! Kelli designs most talks to be engaging and interactive. Participants often ask questions and discuss their own histories with the films and locations. Additionally, some programs include polls and trivia!

## What are your technical requirements for in-person talks?

Kelli creates and projects all content using her MacBook Pro, with video footage and other media embedded in Apple programs. For in-person programs, a projector, large screen, HDMI cable, and audio equipment are required.

## Can talks be customized?

At this time, talks are presented as described, with full program details shared in advance.
